Each of the four charities chosen by the committee this year provided a spokesperson to describe how they plan of to put the funds to work. Boys and Girls Club of New York Elementary will support their afterschool program. Lawrence Parents as teachers plans to purchase hearing screening equipment and provide teaching support for families with children from birth to age three. GaDuGi will furnish a child friendly, safe interview room at the Douglas County Sheriff's Office. The Lawrence High School Positive Support Team will use the money to provide incentives and school supplies for at risk students.

Announcements were also made about fund raising progress thus far at the various activities hosted by the St. Patrick's Day Committee. T-shirt sales have exceeded \$7,500. The Pub Quiz Trivia Night raised over \$3,000. The Charity Benefit Auction brought in a little over \$32,000. Totals for Saturday's events have not been finalized as yet but, the Dart Tournament and Chili contest at the Red Lyon along with the record breaking, 619 participants at the 5K Shamrock Shuffle on the river levee and at Johnny's should exceed \$12,000. This means the Committee's efforts this year will bring its 22 year total proceeds to an amount in excess of one-half million dollars. The Committee still has two events to go. Next Saturday the Luck-of –the-Irish Motorcycle Run will start at Slow Ride Roadhouse in Lawrence at 12 noon, registration begins at 10:30am. The rally will travel to Topeka, Oskaloosa, Tonganoxie, and back to Lawrence to end at the Jet Lag around 4:00pm. Then on Tuesday, March 17<sup>th</sup> at 1:00pm the Lawrence St. Patrick's Day Parade will begin at South Park travel through downtown and North Lawrence.
